PARISH TRANSFORMATION

The Parish Transformation Road Map

- A. Through Parish Transformation, we will evaluate how we are living out Christ's mission through our parish community in today's world. Here is a brief preview of the questions and topics we will reflect upon to do this:
 - ♦ How mission is at the heart of our parish life?
 - ♦ What are our "Pearls of Great Price?" In other words, what is special about our parish that we should celebrate and build upon?
 - ♦ Who are we as a parish? What is important to us? What do we appear to value the most?
 - ♦ How are we living out the 7 "Building Blocks for Mission?" We will explain more about each Building Block in future weeks, but the 7 Building Blocks are:
 - **◊** Evangelization
 - ♦ Catechesis
 - ♦ Prayer & Worship
 - **♦** Communion
 - ♦ Missionary Spirit
 - ♦ Call to Holiness
 - ♦ Spiritual Stewardship
 - ♦ After these reflections, we will articulate a "Mission Narrative." This Mission Narrative does not replace our mission statement. Rather, it is meant to articulate a vision of how we are called to carry out our mission based on who we are as a parish, what we value, and what inspires us. This will set the foundation for developing an action plan that will include specific goals and actions for how we will live out Christ's mission even more vibrantly.
 - ♦ We will then break into smaller groups to develop specific plans for Mission, Education, and Finance.
 - ♦ The final product of our efforts will be a plan that articulates how we aspire to more fully live out Christ's mission through our parish and how we plan to support this mission financially. Our team will present the final plan to Bishop Andrew Wypych, the Episcopal Vicar of Vicariate V as a celebration of our efforts and to kick off implementation of the plan.

We Catholics say things like

this all the time: get the baby baptized, get

married, and—even—get ordained. The getting speaks of a momentary ritual, holy no doubt but then finished. After you get something, you've got it. But there is a mistake in thinking about the sacraments this way. We don't get them as much as they get us. What do I mean?

The sacraments surely have a focused ritual moment, but they also lead us beyond the moment. The sacraments are meant to shape the way we live. From the moment we are baptized or married or ordained or whatever sacrament we celebrate, that particular sacrament ushers us into a new way of living. It begins—if we are open and responsive to it—a new and fresh pattern of life as a disciple of Jesus or as a sign of God's love in the world or as a shepherd extending the Good Shepherd's care. Clearly, God's creative hand is here at work in our lives.

Frequently Asked Questions:

<u>Who do I contact for further information</u>? You may contact the Parish Office and ask for one of the commission head staff members (Spiritual Life - Mike Callahan;

Human Concerns - Christine Collins; Education/Formation - Colleen Walery; Parish Life – Janis O'Boye) who will provide you with the name of the ministry head for the ministry you have selected. Ministry heads are parishioners just like you!

<u>Are there any requirements?</u> Some ministries are only for adults 16 and over and, of course, children's ministries like Children's Choir and Religious Education will have age limits. Being a baptized Catholic is necessary for some faith and sacrament ministries.

Live the Joy of the Gospel...All are welcome!

<u>Are there any dues or fees</u>? Ministry <u>volunteers</u> are only asked for the generous donation of their time and talents to serve. There are <u>no</u> dues or fees for most ministries.

<u>Any instruction or training</u>? Ministry heads are responsible to provide direction and guidance regarding the "how and what to do". Some ministries dealing with faith education and instruction may have required seminar or class type instruction. Bereavement and Eucharistic Ministers do have arch diocesan-required training. Ministries which interact with children are required to complete archdiocese "Protecting God's Children" training.

<u>How long can I serve?</u> There is no term of service. Parishioners have served for long periods and others for short periods. Our ministry sign-up is conducted annually to build awareness for new parisl ioners and bring in new volunteers.

<u>Are there lots of meetings</u>? Ministries really only "meet" when they are in action doing the ministries' work. A few ministries may have short annual meetings for scheduling and clarification of their service responsibilities.




Mom and Tot 'workout' in the gym Tuesdays 10AM-11AM
