We also have recommended songs for your consideration. These beautiful hymns are part of the prayer of the church. They have been arranged according to the appropriate times of the Mass to assist you in the selection process.

Please know that we will assist you in every way we can so this prayerful experience will offer you and your loved ones the Peace that only Christ can give.

The loss of a loved one is a time of tremendous grief as well as a time of intense hope. Our faith tells us that your loved one is with God.

“The celebration of the Christian funeral brings hope and consolation to the living. While proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ and witnessing to Christian hope in resurrection, the funeral rites also recall to all who take part in them God’s mercy and judgment and meet the human need to turn always to God in times of crisis.”

The Order of Christian Funerals

You are about to plan the Mass of Christian Burial for your loved one. We hope that the information in this booklet will assist you and be a source of consolation for you. The Pastoral Care Coordinator from Our Lady of the Woods will be contacting you to assist you in the planning of the liturgy prior to the wake services.

Guidelines for Planning Funerals

Please select **two readings** for the funeral liturgy; **one** from the **Old Testament** and one from the **New Testament**.

The presider usually selects the Gospel.

Choose **Intercessions** from Pages 36 - 39. All on either page are to be read by family member or presider.

Music for the Funeral Mass is to be sacred in nature. Secular songs are not fitting for the celebration of the Eucharist.

Choose four songs for the Liturgy from the music listed on Pages 41 & 42.

We **encourage family members to participate** in the Mass by serving as Readers (proclaiming the Word), presenting the Offertory Gifts of Bread and Wine and as a Eucharistic Minister, if a family member is one in his/her parish.

Reflection of the deceased's Faith Life is permitted. It should be 3-5 minutes, typed and double spaced. Requests for a reflection must be approved by the Church's minister in advance. **Guidelines Page 43**.

Poems, stories and eulogies are best shared at the funeral home during the time of the wake.

Once you have chosen the readings and songs, please complete the last two pages of this booklet and arrange to meet with the church minister. Thank you.

Cremation & the Catholic Church

Since 1963, cremation has been an acceptable option for those of the Catholic faith. Whenever possible, however, the church always prefers the interment or entombment of the body because it gives fuller expression to our Christian faith.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, while noting that cremation is permitted, stresses that the Church holds a preference for full-body burial. The USCCB explained, "The Church's reverence and care for the body grows out of a reverence and concern for the person whom the Church now commends to the care of God. . . . The human body is so inextricably associated with the human person that it is hard to think of a human person apart from his or her body."

When cremation is chosen, the preferred sequence for the final rites is for cremation to take place after the Funeral Mass. Whether cremation takes place before or after the funeral rites, the church expects these families to seek an appropriate final resting place for the cremated remains of the body. The scattering of the cremated remains or keeping the cremated remains in a home are not the reverent disposition that the church requires.

The Catholic Cemeteries offer the following options for those choosing cremation:

Niches - an above ground burial crypt, sized for an urn containing the cremated remains of the body and allowing for identification and remembrance.

Graves - smaller sized graves that allow for a grave marker to be placed identifying and remembering the deceased.

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For this is why Christ died and came to life, that He might be Lord of both the dead and the living. For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of God; for it is written:

“As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me, and every tongue shall give praise to God.”

So then all of us shall give an account of ourselves to God.

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Music

Liturgical music is the music used in the celebration of official public worship of the Church. The Bishops of Vatican II noted that music is more sacred the more it is an integral part of the liturgical action. At times, a single word, verse or melody will reach the heart of the assembly. In that instant, the group finds itself in communion with each other: one heart, one mind, one voice.

“The liturgy is a complexus of signs expressed by living human beings. Music, being preeminent among those signs, ought to be ‘live’... it (recorded music) should, as a general norm, never be used within the liturgy” The Liturgy Document

Reflection of Faith Life – Specific Guidelines

Rite of Christian Funerals is very specific about a reflection.

The Funeral Mass is a **sacred time** at which we celebrate your loved one's going home to God. The Reflection comes after we have received Holy Communion– we are in a **sacred place**. Thus, we ask that you adhere to the following guidelines.

- It is to *focus on the faith life of the deceased*.
 - It reflects on what the deceased taught you or others about God, morals, values, etc.
 - If ill for some time or in Hospice – how did he/she deal with illness?
 - It reflects on the kind of person the deceased was towards his family (spouse, children, grandchildren, extended family).
 - It can reflect on how he/she treated others.
 - *The ending is very important – see next sentence.*
- The closing of the reflection should speak of the fact that this Mass celebrates the deceased entering new life with Christ and that one day we will see him/her in the heavenly kingdom.*

This Reflection needs to be approved by the Church Minister, Michelle Hilliard, as soon as possible, prior to the wake service. Thank you.
